

Day in the Life: D1 Year

Learn more about the day-to-day routine of a 1st year dental student at UNC ASOD

Your first semester consists of a mixture of didactic and clinical classes which means a lot of your time will be spent in a lecture hall with a few days per week in lab. Your two most time-consuming classes are Gross Anatomy and Dental Anatomy – this means a lot of cadaver lab time and waxing teeth! You may even have a course where you begin to use a dental handpiece and start to learn about dental fillings.

Here's what a typical day may look like:

- 6:30am: Get up & make that coffee...you're gonna need it.
- 8:00am: Lecture begins. A lot of those early AM classes are the longer ones (Gross and Dental Anatomy).
- 11:00am: Yep, more class. By this point you have typically switched gears to another class...maybe dental materials or ethics.
- 1:00pm: Lunch, yay! Everyone regardless of their class year has the same lunch. You
 may spend this time in a Lunch & Learn, hanging out in the atrium, or going to the

Getting into Dental School: Letters of Rec

How do you ask for a LOR?

Letters of recommendation are an important aspect of the dental school application; as you're completing your undergrad, start thinking about who you could ask to write you a good recommendation and make an effort to form relationships.

- Tip #1: With applications opening in June, ask early in the new year to be courteous of other commitments they may have. Give them plenty of time to complete your recommendation!
- Tip #2: Give your professors a deadline that is a little before when you actually need the letter to have a buffer period.
- Tip #3: Different dental schools may require specific letters, such as one from a science professor, one from a professor within the student's major, and/or one from a dentist you have a personal relationship with or a dentist you shadowed who can speak on your behalf. Some schools also have a "committee" process for compiling letters of recommendation, so check with your pre-professional advisor (if applicable) as to what kind of process your undergrad school uses!
- Tip #4: You also can submit supplementary letters that can strengthen your application (from a mentor, coach, supervisor, etc.), but make sure to not have an excessive amount that will weigh down your application - choose wisely!
